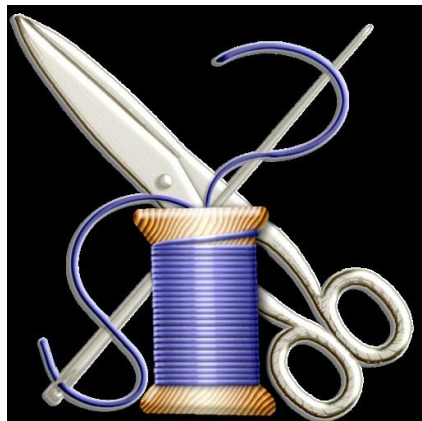

CLASS 39

Quilts should be hand quilted unless otherwise stated. Quilts to be considered for the Annual OAAS Competitions to be entered in the appropriate category.

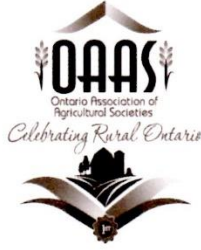
SMA and SBA

Judging is:	20% quilting	20% design
	15% general appearance	10% binding & picot
	5% lining	10% colour
	10% material	10% borders

01. OAAS Hand Quilted Quilt Competition – see rules
02. OAAS Machine Quilted Quilt Competition – see rules
03. Quilt made by group or organization –any size – hand quilted
04. Quilt hand appliqued, hand quilted
05. Crib or lap quilt - any technique – hand quilted
06. Crib or lap quilt – any technique – machine quilted – not long arm
07. My First Quilt made by first time quilter – hand or machine quilted - any size
08. Quilt –any technique, any size – machine quilted long arm
09. Quilt – any technique, any size – machine quilted not long arm
10. Quilt – any technique, any size – hand quilted
11. Quilt block – a work in progress – mounted on cardboard
12. Barn Quilt Piece – Crafted by a 4-H member

Hand Quilted Quilt Competition



ELIGIBILITY, RULES AND REGULATIONS:

General Conditions

- A. Entries must be solely made and hand quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS) to be eligible for this competition.
- B. Entry quilts must be a minimum of 324" measured on the perimeter (smaller quilts will not be eligible to proceed to the next level of competition)
- C. The winner's name and pattern to be displayed at the Fair on sign provided by OAAS.
- D. Judging will occur at local fairs and district levels. A Provincial Grand Champion Quilt will be selected at the Annual OAAS Convention.
- E. Upon making an entry into the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Quilt Competition, the Exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.
- F. The winning Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Champion Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future District and/or Convention OAAS competition.

Local Fair Competition

1. Local fair is entitled to send only the Grand Champion Quilt, (min. 324" measured on the perimeter) judged the best of show of all hand quilted quilts to the District Competition . **OR**

If any entry wins GRAND CHAMPION or BEST of ALL ELIGIBLE QUILTS at more than one Fair, the other Fairs at which this quilt was entered and won, should enter their RESERVE CHAMPION or SECOND BEST OF SHOW OF ALL CLASSES quilt in the District Competition.

NOTE: If an Exhibitor wins GRAND CHAMPION or BEST of SHOW of ALL ELIGIBLE quilts at other than his/her own fair, or at more than one Fair, the Exhibitor must consider the Agricultural Society nearest his/her home address as the one from which the quilt will be sent to the District meeting.

2. An Exhibitor who wins more than one Best of Show title with a different quilt at different Fairs shall be entitled to enter each winning quilt to compete at the District Competition.
3. Local Homecraft Divisions are requested to judge a GRAND CHAMPION or BEST of SHOW of all ELIGIBLE quilts. As well as RESERVE Grand Champion or SECOND Best of Show of all ELIGIBLE quilts.

The GRAND CHAMPION and the RESERVE GRAND CHAMPION are judged from all first and second prize ELIGIBLE quilts.

Machine Quilted Quilt Competition



ELIGIBILITY, RULES AND REGULATIONS:

General Conditions

- A. Quilt must be solely made and machine quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS) fair to be eligible for this competition.
- B. Quilt to be measured on the perimeter .Total perimeter measurement to be a minimum of 324 inches .Note the quilt can be square , rectangular etc.
- C. Judging will occur at local fairs and district levels. A Provincial Grand Champion Machine Quilted Quilt will be selected at the Annual OAAS Convention.
- D. Upon making entry into the OAAS Machine Quilting Competition, the Exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.
- E. The winning OAAS Machine Quilted Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future District and/or OAAS Provincial competition.
- F. The winner's name to be displayed at the Fair on sign provided by OAAS.
- G. Quilt must have visible machine quilting.

Local Fair Competition

- 1 Each local fair is entitled to send only one Grand Champion Machine-Quilted Quilt, judged best of show of all eligible machine quilted Quilt to the District Competition **OR**

If any entry wins *Grand Champion* or *Best of Show* of all eligible *Machine-Quilted Quilts* at more than one Fair, the other Fairs at which this item was entered and won, should enter their *Reserve Champion* or *Second Best of Show* of eligible Machine-Quilted Quilt in the District Competition.

NOTE: If an Exhibitor wins *Grand Champion* or *Best of Show* of all eligible *Machine-Quilted classes* at other than his/her own fair, or at more than one Fair, the Exhibitor must consider the Agricultural Society nearest his/her home address as the one from which the Quilt will be sent to the District competition.

2. An Exhibitor who wins more than one Best of Show title with a different machine quilted Quilt at different Fairs shall be entitled to enter each winning Quilt to compete at the District Competition
3. Local Homecraft Divisions are requested to judge a *Grand Champion* or *Best of Show* of all eligible *Machine-Quilted Quilt* as well as a *Reserve Champion* or *Second Best of Show* of eligible Machine-Quilted Quilt.

The Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion are judged from all first and second prize ELIGIBLE machine quilted Quilts.

SPINNING/ WEAVING/FELTING: Please include a sample of the fleece and/or materials used

01. A Sample of handspun yarn/fiber –approximately 3 meters - named
02. Any woven article – named- SYA
03. Any felted article – named- SMA
04. Any article made of handspun yarn/fiber – name fiber used - SYA

SEWING: SMA to be attached to all articles:

05. Article using smocking
06. Apron
07. Hand sewn item (no machine stitching)
08. Article for household use – eg. Table runner, curtains, etc.
09. Article of clothing – not apron
10. Item made for a pet
11. Reusable shopping bag
12. Handmade toy – sewing machine allowed
13. Handmade cloth doll – sewing machine allowed
14. Any other article not mentioned

KNITTING: SYA to be attached to all articles

15. Hat any size
16. Article of clothing for a baby or toddler
17. Adult sweater – for the experienced knitter – consideration to be given to pattern difficulty
18. Socks – pair
19. Toy or animal
20. Scarf
21. My first knitting project – any item made by a beginning knitter
22. Afghan – minimum size 36” by 48”
23. Any item not listed

CROCHET: SYA to be attached to all articles

24. Article of clothing not already listed
25. Pair of slippers or socks
26. My first crochet project – any item made by a beginner
27. Dish cloth
28. Crib blanket
29. Hat
30. Toy or animal
31. Doll outfit
32. Any item not listed

EMBROIDERY: SYA to be attached to all articles

- 33. Any article of hand embroidery
